6 Things You Need to Get Started in Music Lessons

Getting started in music lessons is easier than you might think. In fact, some of the things on our list are things you already have – no purchase necessary!

#1 - An instrument

The only time you don't have to rent or purchase an instrument for music lessons is if you're taking voice lessons. Otherwise, you will need an instrument on which to practice during the week in between lessons. Your practice at home is what will ensure that you are making steady progress.

For purchasing a piano, we recommend spending some time with the good folks at Piano Central. For rentals of other instruments, we recommend Musical Innovations.

#2 - Self-motivation

If you're taking the time to read about these six things, chances are the motivation for taking music lessons is already there in one form or another. It is true that motivation, even more than raw talent, is one of the biggest factors to long-term success in music lessons. Younger beginners may need a little help in the self-motivation department, but if a love for music is there, chances are that the self-motivation will come out too.

#3 - A perfect fit

Here's one that can be a little harder, but it is oh-so-worth-it to find that good teacher match – someone that you or your child clicks with, someone who is committed to help you reach your musical goals, someone who will inspire you, someone you like and trust, and someone who is musically qualified.

#4 - Time for practice

This is important to think through ahead of time. Taking lessons without practice time is pretty much a waste of money and time. But making time for practice doesn't have to be hard. It simply take a little planning, a little commitment, and sometimes a little creativity. (For example, 10 minutes in the morning before breakfast and 10 minutes just before supper still gets in 20 minutes a day – plenty of time for beginning and early level students.)

#5 - Convenient scheduling

Since you'll come for a lesson on the same day and at the same time week after week, finding a weekly lesson day and time that consistently works in your busy schedule is an important part of taking lessons. You don't want to miss more lessons than you take just because of scheduling!

#6 - Goals to accomplish

One big reason for taking lessons is just to learn to play or sing! But take it a step further. WHY do you want to learn to play the piano or sing? Maybe it's for fun or as a hobby. Maybe it's because you want to be part of the music ministry at your church or you want to be able to entertain friends. Maybe it's because music is an outlet for you, an important way to express yourself or relieve stress. Maybe it's because you love music and fell like you might have a future with music. Think about your goals and then don't hesitate to share those goals with your music teacher.
